Determine viability

A urine test alone does not determine if a pregnancy is viable or not. A urine test will detect the presence of the hormone HCG which is present during a pregnancy. This hormone can be present up to 6-8 weeks following a miscarriage. Up to 30% of pregnancies can end in miscarriage.

Pregnancy & Infant Care

Pregnancy and Infant Care are filled with lots of uncertainty. This program helps to answer many of the questions you have and ease your anxiety. Our Best Beginnings program is designed to support you during pregnancy and through the first months of parenthood.

Best Beginnings offers over 90 different topics that new parents will find very helpful including pregnancy, health related issues, breast feeding, labor and delivery, care of your newborn, bonding, discipline and safety issues. With each session you attend, you earn vouchers which can be used in our Beginnings Boutique to acquire new baby and maternity items or personal items for mom and dad! Many people want to learn how to be good parents and raise a healthy, happy child.

The Best Beginnings program is very flexible. You choose only the classes you wish to take and classes are scheduled when it is convenient for you. You may choose to take 3, 20, 50 or any number of the available topics. You will be paired with a clinic nurse or a parenting advocate who will provide you with the support and resources you need during this time of transition and change. Together you will decide which lessons are important to you and she will cover the lessons that meet your individual learning needs.

Childbirth Education

These classes are designed for women and couples who may feel more comfortable attending classes with others who may be facing similar life situations. Some women attending may be going into a pregnancy alone, may be very young birth moms, may not be able to afford to pay for classes, may be planning on parenting or may be placing their newborns for adoption.

Whatever your situation, you will find a caring and supportive environment to learn about pregnancy and childbirth. Feel free to attend with a friend or your partner.

Week 1 includes the car seat class. Instruction on Safe Sleep, Infant CPR and basic first aid is covered during Week 3.

The goal of PHMDC Pregnancy Services is Healthy Mothers, Healthy Babies, Healthy Families. Public Health provides free help and support to pregnant women through two programs:

Nurse-Family Partnership Program: Provides frequent public health nurse visits during pregnancy and until the baby is 2 years old. This service is for first-time moms.

Prenatal Care Coordination: Provides monthly public health nurse visits during pregnancy and until the baby is 2 months old.

Both programs provide services needed to have a healthy pregnancy and healthy baby:

Health assessment.

Help with finding a prenatal health care provider.

Help with finding free or low-cost health insurance for themselves and their families (Badgercare Plus, Medicaid).

Help with finding needed community services.

Help with transportation to medical appointments.

Information on good nutrition and health habits while pregnant, labor and delivery, infant care, feeding your baby, parenting, child development and safety.

Information on pregnancy planning, birth control, preconception and interconception health (between pregnancies). Information on staying alcohol and tobacco free during pregnancy.

Help finding treatment for alcohol, tobacco and other drug use.

Help finding shelter from domestic abuse.

Breastfeeding education and support.
